Some of the work the council has been undertaking recently:

Benches

We have installed a bench at Durleigh Wetlands, with the kind permission of Wessex Water. It is a lovely spot to stop and appreciate the beautiful views and nature.

Along with the bench previously installed along the footpath between Durleigh Wetlands and Rexworthy Farm, there are plenty of resting places to enjoy a longer walk.

Queenswood Lane

Since resurfacing the lane, the council monitors the lane and when necessary, councillors go and sweep the lane to clear any debris. We have also worked in partnership with Somerset Council and Bridgwater Town Council to remove a number of dead trees along the lane, making it safer.

Road Signs

We are liaising with Somerset Highways about road safety around Durleigh and presently we are trying to get improved safety signage for Durleigh Hill to warn drivers of the narrow lane and 'oncoming vehicles in middle of road'. There have been a number of accidents in this area and we are hoping improved signage will prevent any more.
